You might know about smear tests. They can stop cervical cancer from ever developing.


You're invited regularly from 25 to 64

So make sure you know the symptoms:

- **Vaginal bleeding that is unusual for you**
- **Changes to vaginal discharge**
- **Pain or discomfort during sex**
- **Pain in your lower back or pelvis**




The earlier cervical cancer is found, the easier it is to treat.
